Enhancing Learning, Teaching & Assessment



Context



This level 9 programme is designed to support the development of inclusive learning, teaching and assessment of a diverse range of students within the early education, primary, post-primary, higher and further education sectors. The suite of offerings provide academics with the opportunity to develop their professional practice. The modules explore the link between effective teaching and reflective practice, providing learners with the scope to critically analyse their own teaching practice. A key feature of the programme is the relationship between effective teaching and reflective practice; the imperative to reflect on not only what we should teach, but how effectively, creatively and inclusively we teach a diverse range of learners. In every module critical reflective practice, based on evidence rather than anecdote, is required and used as the basis for self-evaluation and self-improvement. The collection and analysis of evidence will therefore be a prominent feature of the programme as a whole.

Key Features

The programme promotes a student-centred approach to inclusive learning and teaching. It supports professional development/reflective practice, providing an opportunity to develop skills through practically focused modules, while away from the busy work environment. The blended approach, with most classes now online during weekday evenings, also helps the busy professional to integrate study and work. The programme reflects the growing understanding of the central role of assessment and feedback, Universal Design for Learning, technology

enhanced learning and evidence-based research at each stage of learning. Students will have the opportunity to work collaboratively across disciplines with practitioners from all levels within education. In this way the programme provides a unique opportunity for educators to deepen their understanding of teaching and learning across different stages of education and informed by multiple levels of interlocking practice in the field of learning and teaching.

Key Features Include:

- Focus on developing professional practice in learning and teaching that embraces a diversity of learners and employs effective and creative pedagogies
- Development of digital teaching and learning expertise to make more effective use of technology in enhancing practice
- Choice in capstone module a work-based learning project or a dissertation

- Leading national and international best practice speakers
- Blended learning delivery: maximum 1 Saturday per semester face to face
- Work based learning and research in all modules
- All assessment are practice-based assignments
- Links theory to practice

Reflective Learning

An integral part of the programme is reflective learning within the student's own institution. This approach provides the opportunity to evaluate and integrate theory, research and practice. The use of work-related projects gives students the scope to critically analyse their own teaching practice. This follows through to the capstone module of a work-based learning project or a

dissertation. Students will plan and carry out research projects in specific curricular areas of teaching.

Graduates of this programme will develop strong analytical skills through practitioner based research and critical reflective practice.

Costs

The programme fee is €5,800 payable in two instalments. The first instalment of €2,900 is due on commencement while the second instalment is due at the beginning of year 2.

Application Process – Experience Counts

Entry requirements are a Level 8 Degree, minimum of Second Class Honours, Grade 2 or equivalent. ATU Donegal operates a Recognition of Prior Experiential Learning (RPL) scheme where applicants may be considered based on relevant work and other experience, for exemptions from programme modules and advanced entry. Throughout this programme, critical reflection on teaching and learning practices is an integral part of an evidence based approach to teacher development; therefore, applicants must be currently involved in an active teaching role.

Programme Structure & Delivery

The programme will be delivered mostly online. All modules will be delivered online on Tuesday & Thursday evenings from 7-9pm, while selective modules (3 in total) will have one Saturday face to face included in the schedule.

The duration of the programme is two years part-time and involves learners undertaking the following modules:
