




See our map below to view the distance in kilometres to both our campuses from various locations in Ireland.



CONNACHT-ULSTER ALLIANCE

The new Technological University (TU) for the West and North-West of Ireland will be one of the largest multi-campus universities on the island, bringing together students, enterprise and communities spanning a unique geographical region in transition. The region offers a high level of cultural, artistic and outdoor activities providing an excellent quality of life for its inhabitants.

The TU will be a leader in the provision of access to Higher Education by offering programmes from pre-degree to doctoral level on campus, online or as remote learning. As a TU, we will deepen collaborative partnerships with Further and Higher Education institutions and organisations in the public and private sectors. As one entity, the new distinctive TU will act in a coherent manner supporting the needs of enterprises, especially SMEs, across the region through collaborative research and enabling technology transfer to support economic and social prosperity. It will provide research-informed

teaching and access to emerging technologies for all learners.

The TU will have the critical mass and academic depth to attract, educate, nurture and retain talent in the West, North-West and cross-border region and will strengthen and benefit our region socially, economically and culturally. As a TU of scale, quality and impact we will have greater capacity for collaboration with international partners and our graduates will have excellent employment potential nationally and internationally.

The Connacht-Ulster Alliance (CUA) of LYIT, GMIT, and IT Sligo has reached a significant milestone of meeting the TU criteria and, in May 2021, formally submitted its application to become a TU. Following an international evaluation process, the CUA expects to begin operating as a multi-campus university in early 2022.

LYIT's teams compete in the higher education and university competitions throughout the sporting calendar. These men's and ladies' **sports teams** have moved from strength to strength in recent years, and we are excited for that trend to continue in the coming years. We also support and encourage the participation and competitive efforts of **individual sports** students, such as Athletics, Boxing and Karate.

The Institute has been successful in Gaelic football with the men's team reaching the semi-final of the Sigerson Cup in 2020. In Soccer the ladies team reached the semi-final of the O'Regan Cup, while two members of our Boxing team won national titles this

year in the Third Level Boxing Championships, and in Athletics one of our students won the gold medal in the Shot Putt in the Irish Universities Athletics Indoor Championships.

Our LYIT gyms are located in both our Letterkenny and Killybegs campuses. The gyms are free to use for all LYIT students and comprise of a wide array of dual-use cardio machines and resistance equipment. The Sports Centre staff are also here to help you on the way to meeting your exercise goals through fitness programming. Daily exercise classes are provided to those students who like to work within a small group setting.



Facilities include:

- On-campus, floodlit pitch and indoor training facility
- Multi-purpose sports centre with the latest equipment, including a large activity hall with bleacher seating, handball wall, shower and changing facilities
- A modern fitness suite with fully trained staff to provide personal instruction and classes such as Spin-Fit, Step Aerobics, Pilates, Yoga, Bootcamp, Dance and Circuit Training
- Health and fitness advice, recreation courses and wheelchair sports are also organised as well as staff/student games, intervarsity competitions and community activities

Clubs & Societies



SCHOLARSHIPS AT LYIT

Scoláireachtaí ag LYIT

LYIT currently offers six types of scholarships to new entrant undergraduate students:

- ➔ REACH Scholarships
- ➔ New Entrant Sports Scholarships
- ➔ Optum North-West Healthcare Scholarships
- ➔ The 1916 Bursary Fund
- ➔ College of Sanctuary Scholarships
- ➔ LYIT/GPA Scholarship



⇒ REACH Scholarships

LYIT has established a Bursary Scheme (REACH) to support and facilitate students wishing to complete an undergraduate programme. REACH is targeting students who might not progress onto third level due to having a disability or lacking the financial wherewithal to participate. At present the REACH Scholarship is worth €800. In 2019/20, 40 REACH Scholarships were awarded to students.

⇒ New Entrant Sports Scholarships

Provided you are accepted onto a full-time course in LYIT, either as undergraduate or postgraduate, and are currently a member of a GAA County Football or Hurling panel, or a member of a League of Ireland Soccer panel, or a member of a national Basketball squad, you are eligible to apply for a New Entrant Sports Scholarship. At present the value of a New Entrant Scholarship is €1,500. In 2019/20, 16 New Entrant Sports Scholarships were awarded to students. In addition to the above, LYIT offers the following scholarships to existing students of the Institute:

Full-Time Sports Scholarship

At present the value of the Full-Time Sports Scholarship ranges from €1,000 - €1,500. In 2019/20, the Institute awarded 55 Full-time Sports Scholarships.

⇒ Optum North-West Healthcare Scholarships

The Optum North-West Healthcare Scholarships delivered in partnership with LYIT and Ulster University (UU). The aim of the scheme is to support young people in County Donegal, particularly those who are less advantaged, to access third-level education. Optum recognise the contribution that the innovative partnership between LYIT and UU has made to increasing accessibility to third-level education in the North-West. In 2019/20, the Optum North-West Healthcare Scholarships was awarded to four students joining LYIT as first year students, this Scholarship is worth €2,500 per annum.

⇒ The 1916 Bursary Fund

The 1916 Bursary Fund is a targeted funding scheme established by the Department of Education and Skills to support the implementation of the National Plan for Equity of Access to Higher Education 2015-2019. The National Access Plan is working to increase the numbers of students who are currently under-represented in Higher Education. The Bursaries are targeted at students who are socio-economically disadvantaged and from target groups that have low participation rates in Higher Education.


⇒ College of Sanctuary Scholarships

The College of Sanctuary Scholarships are open to academically eligible asylum seekers and those in Direct Provision. Sanctuary Scholarships are available only to migrants who do not qualify for consideration under the 1916 Bursary Fund. LYIT provides a maximum of three Sanctuary Scholarships annually. The Sanctuary Scholarship consists of a waiver of the €10,000 fee that normally applies to non-EU students.

⇒ LYIT/GPA Postgraduate Scholarships

This recently launched LYIT/GPA (Gaelic Players Association) partnership allows for up to four fully funded, postgraduate places to male and female members of the GPA who wish to study at LYIT. The value of each scholarship is up to €5,750 for one year only and will be delivered through a full or partial fee waiver where necessary. LYIT will contribute 50% of the programme fee to a maximum of €2,875 with the GPA contributing the remaining 50% of the programme fee to a maximum of €2,875.

SUPPORTING YOUR JOURNEY

Creating a nurturing and caring environment for all students has always been central to LYIT's culture.

At registration, you'll be given a student handbook which provides the inside track on support services available at the Institute. This handbook also contains lots of very useful information on how to survive and thrive in college. Student Support Services available at LYIT include:

Health Service: This is free to all full-time registered students and consists of a full-time nurse and a daily doctor's surgery.

Counselling Service: The Student Counselling Service is provided by a chartered Psychologist and is free to all registered students.

Chaplaincy: The college has a team of chaplains, representing several denominations.

Career and further study advice: The Careers Service helps you to make informed choices and identify occupations that would suit your interests, personality and qualification, and is available to all students and recent graduates of LYIT.

The Students' Union: The Students' Union (SU) is for you – all full-time registered students automatically become members of the union. Active participation in the SU is encouraged. Each year the students elect three sabbatical officers to act on their behalf. Representatives from the SU sit on the Governing Body and Academic Council and work with the academic, welfare and support staff of the Institute on behalf of all students. The SU is affiliated to the Union of Students in Ireland (USI).

Childcare support: Crèche subsidy is available to support students with young families. Students that qualify for this subsidy can get all relevant information from the Students' Union Welfare Officer.






The Curve: Tailored Learning at LYIT

When you feel good about life you can embrace your studies with confidence. That is why we have such strong learning support structures in place for all of our students. The Learning Support Unit at LYIT, titled 'The Curve', was established to encourage and support all students throughout their time at LYIT. The Curve offers invaluable advice and support to a diverse range of students and operates an open-door policy at all times.

LYIT is fully committed to developing and promoting initiatives which seek to counter socio-economic and learning disadvantage. The Curve provides specific advice and support to a diverse range of students, including:

- Students with disabilities
- Mature students (aged 23 years or older)
- Students from ethnic minorities
- Students from low income families.



Mathematics Learning Centre

The purpose of the Mathematics Learning Centre (MLC) is to support students' mathematics learning across all courses in LYIT. Perhaps you lack confidence in your ability to do mathematics? Perhaps you missed out somewhere along the line or had a negative experience learning maths? Whatever the reason, the MLC will help you at LYIT.

The MLC offers the following services:

- Small group tutorial support in Maths and Physics topics
- Limited individual consultations
- Exam revision support sessions
- Online support via Blackboard and email
- Access to special resources including digital pencasts.



Communication Learning Centre

The aim of the Communication Learning Centre (CLC) is to help students with academic writing and study skills. This service is for all students at LYIT. The CLC provides a number of workshops throughout the academic year. The CLC offers the following services:

- Preparing and delivering an effective presentation
- Writing an essay: advice on process and structure
- Advice on referencing and avoiding plagiarism
- Advice on exam preparation and technique
- Turn-it-in advice and information.

QuickScan

QuickScan is an easy to use, multi-functional screening questionnaire that takes 10-20 minutes to complete and identifies specific areas of learning strengths and weaknesses. All first year students at LYIT undertake the QuickScan questionnaire on registration day in September. On completion, QuickScan generates a report that identifies:

- The student's preferred learning style, giving strategies and information on how to get the best out of time spent studying
- Any learning supports that will help student learning
- Useful studying skills
- Maths difficulties
- Dyspraxia
- Visual stress
- Learning confidence.



Disability Support

At LYIT, we work hard to support students with disabilities, and are passionate about creating a third level community which is accessible and inclusive to all people with disabilities. The Curve is a resource and catalyst for this inclusion, providing technical learning assistance, examination support and personal support for students with physical, sensory or multiple disability. Our support structure also assists students with specific learning difficulties in need of specialist support.

Access & Social Inclusion

At LYIT, we work hard to support students with disabilities, and are passionate about creating a third level community which is accessible and inclusive to all people with disabilities. The Curve is a resource and catalyst for this inclusion, providing technical learning assistance, examination support and personal support for students with physical, sensory or multiple disability. Our support structure also assists students with specific learning difficulties in need of specialist support.

Student Assistance Fund

The Student Assistance Fund (SAF) is a fund which is available to registered students who are experiencing financial hardship. Students requiring financial assistance to help with tuition fees or registration fees cannot be considered under SAF. Students who feel they may be eligible for SAF should contact The Curve directly. Students will be required to complete an application form, and will then have an interview with the Access Officer, the Chaplain and the Student Welfare Officer to determine their eligibility. Qualifying students will be required to provide proof of expenditure.

Letterkenny

Letterkenny is a very lively town, offering excellent shopping, a vibrant nightlife and great opportunities for part-time work, sport, culture and fun. There are plenty of much-loved student haunts: pubs, music venues, nightclubs and restaurants.

In addition you'll find:

- 8-screen cinema with 1,400 seats
- Aura Leisure Complex - a large indoor & outdoor sports and leisure complex with 25m pool, tartan track, gym, etc
- Arena 7 Entertainment Complex - 10-pin bowling, children's play area, etc
- Several hotels with pools and sports facilities open to membership

- Community Centre with indoor and outdoor sports facilities
- An Grianán - a 383 seat theatre, 5 minutes' walk from the college
- Regional Cultural Centre - 5 minutes' walk from the college, incorporating an art gallery, auditorium with 146 seats and full cinema facilities, 3 multi-purpose workshops, 2 dedicated digital media suites and 2 small music rehearsal rooms
- A range of commercial sports venues, including Bowling, Go-Karting, etc
- Various sports clubs & facilities including Golf, Tennis, GAA, Rugby, Athletics, etc.

Killybegs

ACCOMMODATION & STUDENT LIFE

Donegal is one of the most affordable regions to live in, work in and travel around. The cost of living is considerably lower than the national average and the region offers a good variety of affordable student accommodation.

Letterkenny and Killybegs have a good variety of inexpensive accommodation close to campus, so you can enjoy the buzz of student life without breaking the bank. There is no on-campus accommodation but finding pleasant and affordable student

accommodation is not an issue in Letterkenny or Killybegs. There are options for digs, houses to rent on a shared basis, and in Letterkenny there are also apartments specifically built for the student market. Both campuses are quite central and there is plenty of accommodation within 10 minutes' walk of each of the campuses.

The rates below are sample weekly rates (Summer 2020):

- **Apartments:** approx. €55 – €65 rent per person sharing. (Heating, electricity, etc. extra.)
- **House (4-bed semi, 6 sharing):** approx. €40 – €50 rent each. (Heating, electricity, etc. extra.)
- **Digs – 5 days (Monday to Friday – depart each Friday)** €100 per week which includes meals, light, heat and often Wi-Fi

Each year, the Students' Union (SU) compiles and updates a list of Letterkenny accommodation. Each landlord included on this list has complied fully with the standards set by the SU for accommodation and is registered with the Residencies Tenancies Board (RTB). The list is sent out automatically to students who receive an offer from LYIT and is also available online from August of each year.


