PART 2 FINDINGS OF ASSESSORS

The Panel of Assessors are satisfied that the proposal adequately addresses the following criteria:

- 4 .Research Project Design module: The panel recommend that Statistics and Stats training is more explicit in this module.
- 5. Nutrition Module: The panel recommend refer to 'companion animals' in general rather than dogs especially in section 4.
