Student Assistance Fund

Student Assistance Fund (SAF) is a limited fund which may be available to students who are experiencing financial hardship and is advertised on the student notice boards. The SAF is open to full-time registered students. Students on part-time courses or Access students are not eligible to apply.

The SAF is to assist students who are unable to meet costs associated with day-to-day participation in higher education, including:

- Books and class materials
- Essential travel
- Rent, heat and lighting bills
- Medical costs and childcare costs


